CURRENT ACTION:

- SADD – 5 out of 6 schools doing mock crashes. Fall Creek doing body bags for awareness. SADD students are getting Rx Takeback flyers out to their communities.

- Prescription Drug Take Back Day was April 27, 2019. Over 3100 pounds of unused prescription medication was collected. That was more than the total from the two events in 2018.

- Two grant applications for submitted, to support the prevention efforts of the Alliance.

- Lil is working with George Eliopoulos for the diversion program that has come out of the new Public Intox. Ordinance passed last year. It will be done quarterly.
- ASAP partnered with Healthy Communities for the Annual Healthy Communities Celebration and then a workshop (Opioids and Community Response) the next day, Friday, April 26th 8:30-11:30am. Both were well attended and were received well.
- Lil presented at alcohol & tobacco licensing training in Altoona. The new Chief of Police Kelly Baken, Lieutenant David Livingston, a representative from the Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms, were also in attendance and speaking. The ATF representative stated he was impressed by the presentation from the Health Department representative. The updated license application for alcohol was introduced and discussed as well.
- Lil presented to CESA on vaping. AODA coordinators from several schools were in attendance. The feedback from those attending was very positive. Lil let those in attendance know that there is a Vaping conference coming up May 29th, at UWEC, in the Ojibwa Ballroom.
- Lil also represented the Health Department at the two County's Lunch and Learn presentations regarding methamphetamine. There were about 50 people who attended the presentations. Several staff stopped the presenters to thank them for their presentation and stated they learned many new things.

CURRENT ACTION:

- Press release was sent out regarding the poster contest which was held for 4th and 5th graders in Eau Claire County. 117 posters were submitted!
- Updated our Rethink Your Drink tri-fold display with a new picture and more current drinks and submitted to CVTC for printing. These will be displayed at the middle schools in the FACE classrooms.
- We joined efforts with the Alliance for Substance Abuse Prevention to offer a social media contest to all Eau Claire County high schools to create a social media post related to vaping, tobacco, and oral health. Unfortunately, we didn't get any response.
- We have a new member, Elizabeth Rowan, who is from Chippewa and would like to promote our initiatives in that county. She is very involved in volunteering and promoting good oral health practices. She is a great addition to our team!
- Elizabeth and Savannah staffed the Oral Health Promotion table at the Healthy Communities Celebration to share insight on our action team.
- Funding for the MCI grant was cut to every state in the collaborative and we would not receive the \$1500 we have gotten each year. Leadership training and paid registrations for the Wisconsin Oral Health Conference would no longer be available. Due to the continued additional work needed to continue with the coalition and the lack of funding, we decided as a team to discontinue our collaboration.

UPDATES:

- Dockless Bike ordinance. Effort between UWEC and City of Eau Claire. City Council passed this ordinance recently. Goal is to provide another way of transportation for residents. Would be a mobile app where you can check out your bike on your phone; can pay in multiple ways. Looking to bring in a dockless bikeshare vendor. No applicants yet for the vendor. - Health department received grant from Wisconsin DHS. The grant will provide funding and time to raise awareness of cardiovascular disease, diabetes/prediabetes; increase awareness and participation in evidence-based diabetes prevention programs and work on innovative solutions for prevention.
- Discussed the idea of partnering with other action teams on a big project since all action teams health topics are so interconnected. Ideas include: social connectedness as a common theme, partnering with the Wintermission grant, McDonough Park.
- Discussed volunteering as an action team. Aim is to increase awareness of healthy communities, support teambuilding and give back to the community. Group agreed to help with the Amazing Eau Claire Cleanup. Group discussed signing up as a group and inviting members of all action teams/council.

- Discussed trialing social media content (2 per month). Will be using the health department's social media account to post but will then share the link with action teams so they can share the link through their org.

CURRENT ACTION

Healthy Food and Beverages

- UW-Extension shared evaluation data from 2018 Market Match program. Have secured 3 of 4 major funders. Seeing stabilization of number of patrons. Number of tokens purchased each year is increasing. The number of visits per season also increased.
- UW-Extension will pull data around older adults and usage of market match. Anyone wants to volunteer to sell market match at the farmer's market, let Sandy know. If you want to make a tax deductible donation to the market match program, you can write check to Luginbill Children's foundation.

Safe Routes to School

- There's a committee that's begun meeting, looking to organize some public comment/outreach, hoping to complete this and wrap it up by the end of the year. Eau Claire, Chippewa Falls, and Altoona school districts attended meeting, they'd like to meet 3-4 times per year as a region, and invite planners, engineers from each city to have dialogue about what's working, what's not. Working with Chippewa and Altoona this year. . Audits would probably be an "on your own" type of thing, so people could take them and complete them at any time.
- All three have agreed to apply for some funding in the fall, Mayo Clinic Health System Hometown Health Grant also applied for. More about the walking school bus, parent background checks would be required.

Rx for Parks

- Discussed how to include rural parks in the plan. Chad has list of rural parks, and will share with CDPAT. Template that we could use that was done for the city parks. We'd decide on what parks we want to do, based on amenities. Plan to engage with townships and ask the questions we want answers to, then compile the resource.

Chippewa Valley Regional Bike Routes

- Routes thru EC, Chip Falls, Hallie, Altoona. Providing numbered, and colored signs directing people to routes between cities. Next year, large (18x24) signs, color coded. Hoping vehicles might notice that they could be biking a particular route vs. driving
