CURRENT ACTION:

- Food System
 - Approved to host a healthTIDE Regional Rally with a tentative date in August. Goal to engage local business partners as well as other entities involved with the food system. Locations, catering, and agenda are all in the works. Stay tuned!
 - Succeeded in rolling out a second pilot of the FNV campaign. Launched different types of targeted advertising. Will have evaluation soon from first 6 months of FNV campaign.
 - Launched the next round of the convenience store project, targeting rural parts of Dunn, Chippewa and Eau Claire Counties. Will be engaging stores that we’ve worked with in 2015/2016 to assess results of the projects.
- Healthy Community Design and Policy
 - Jason Duba, Audrey Boerner, Ned Noel, Leah Ness, Chad Duerkop and Terry Weld were selected to participate in the NACCD Walkability Institute in Atlanta in April. The team had a webinar preparing for the actual conference. It will be four days in Atlanta with top trainers. As part of this, they expect we will put together an action plan for walkability related action. They will bring back lots of ideas for our action team. Group did report-outs to leadership/department heads at involved agencies recently. They also presented at Invest Health local housing convening later in June.
 - Continuing work on Complete Streets policy and Safe Routes to School.

 - The next upcoming event is the Business Community Downtown Wellness Walk on July 18.

CURRENT ACTION:

- We have gone through all resources that were collected including curriculums, activities, infographics, handouts, videos, and any other resources that youth serving professionals, providers, educators, mentors, coaches, and parents could use to have conversations with youth about healthy relationships. We have decided that we will use meeting time right now to get much of the work done towards completing the resource toolkit.
- Currently we are looking at and reaching out to local resources that we would like to include, specifically that work with young people on issues related to healthy relationships.
- Developing content for each resource included in the toolkit.
- Members of HRPAT are continuing to facilitate Safe Dates. We just finished a cohort at the Northwest Juvenile Detention Center and the DHS SPARKS Program. This summer we will have youth cohorts at the Boys & Girls Club and SPARKS completing Safe Dates.

NEXT STEPS:

- Once content is developed for toolkit we will be looking for folks to help us with formatting this content.
- Develop training for youth serving professionals that incorporates how to use the resource toolkit in addressing healthy relationships with youth served. As we are developing this training we also need to find the best way to partner with schools and youth serving agencies to provide this training.
- HWLI Site Visit is on August 8th, we are planning to focus on how best we can engage school administrations and other organizations as we roll out the tool kit.

CURRENT ACTION:

- Working on Community Health Improvement Plan. Identified two focus areas to concentrate on: percentage of 34rd graders with untreated dental decay in Western Wisconsin and residents 2+ years old that did not have a dental visit in the past year.
- As a follow up to our Inter-professional Event, Deb Schumacher will work with CVTC dental hygiene students to create a PowerPoint or Webinar for health educators at the hospitals to use to train their pre-natal instructors.
- We have created a dental referral form for pregnant women to be given out at their physicians' offices.

NEXT STEPS:

- Update referral list for dentists who will see pregnant women and info for pregnant patients. Possibly have CVTC dental hygiene students do this.
- Work on PowerPoint or webinar for health educators.
- Possibly have CVTC dental hygiene students do a presentation to elementary schools during dental health month in Feb. and repurpose Rethink Your Drink Boards that students created for a contest a few years ago and have been in the storage room.
