CURRENT ACTION:

- Continuing work on the Healthy Relationship Promotion Toolkit
 - We have gone through all resources that were collected including curriculums, activities, infographics, handouts, videos, and any other resources that youth serving professionals, providers, educators, mentors, coaches, and parents could use to have conversations with youth about healthy relationships. We have decided that we will use meeting time right now to get much of the work done towards completing the resource toolkit.
 - Currently we are looking at and reaching out to local resources that we would like to include, specifically that work with young people on issues related to healthy relationships.
 - Developing content for each resource included in the toolkit.
- Members of HRPAT are continuing to facilitate Safe Dates. This summer we facilitated with the SPARKS Program and the Boys & Girls Club. This fall we will be starting up again in Fall Creek and Augusta as well as hopefully adding Regis and Altoona. We will also continue to facilitate with the SPARKS program.
- At the last two meetings and HWLI Site Visit we primarily focused on the CHIP Planning Process.
- Working on messaging for Domestic Violence Awareness Month in October.

NEXT STEPS:

- Once content is developed for toolkit we will be looking for folks to help us with formatting this content.
- Develop training for youth serving professionals that incorporates how to use the resource toolkit in addressing healthy relationships with youth served. As we are

developing this training we also need to find the best way to partner with schools and youth serving agencies to provide this training.

CURRENT ACTION

- Food System: Over the past two months the sub-group has been working with partners in Dunn and Chippewa Counties to pull together the healthTIDE wavemaker regional rally. It was held August 23rd at RCU conference center from 9:30 am to 4 pm, with a focus on food policy and food access. Keynote speaker will be Nadia Berneche; her presentation will be about working together to make impacts with local food systems. There was also a panel discussion from experts across the Chippewa Valley. Local food was catered in for lunch.
- Healthy Community Design and Policy: Jason Duba has relocated and Eric Anderson is replacing him on the CDPAT. No further action at this time.
- Worksite Wellness: Susan Krahn shared the Wisconsin Breastfeeding coalition has a mini-grant for businesses to apply to support breastfeeding at their work sites. This information was forwarded to the team. Additionally, the Chamber offered its third Learning Circle on August 16. The speakers included Dr. Jennifer Eddy, a family physician, discussing high risk drinking habits, and Christina Funk with ReforMedicine, S.C., presenting on obesity and chronic disease.
- The entire CDPAT has spent time at the July and August meetings sharing the process for using the 2018 Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) to identify the team’s goals and objectives for the 2019 – 2021 time period. This began in July with a review of a variety of data points which included:
 - i. The current CHIP plan, Healthiest Wisconsin 2020 plan and the national plan – Healthy People 2020
 - ii. Data from the most recent CHA – which included Secondary Data, Qualitative Survey Assessment data and Health Equity.

- Continuing in our August meeting, the team identified our top three indicators (below) and divided into three small groups to identify root causes:
 - a. Adult Obesity/Childhood Obesity/Overweight
 - b. Screen Time (computer and television usage)
 - c. Food Environment (a measure from County Health Rankings that combines data around food insecurity and access to food)

NEXT STEPS

- Food System: This group is also working to wrap up grant reporting for the most recent round of FNV convenience store funding.
- Healthy Community Design and Policy: Group is waiting new workplan to frame its future action.
- Worksite Wellness: Our committee worked with the EC Chamber in creating the agenda and identifying speakers for the upcoming Healthcare Industry Update Seminar which will be held on September 19 at the Best Western. This was formerly the Affordable Care Act Update but due to no major changes the ACA, the members felt this would be of more interest. Also the team is working on identifying a topic and speaker for the Learning Circle on October 31.
- At the September CDPAT meeting, the team will review draft goals and objectives based upon our discussions. We will also discuss community assets and resource, and lastly, we will start to identify strategies.
