Sober Server or Impaired Server prohibits drinking on duty or limits blood alcohol content or concentration while on duty/working. City of Wausau adopted an ordinance limits acceptable level of impairment to .04 BAC.</p> <p>The analogy of food preparation and food inspections was provided to give context of the importance of creating a healthy environment through policy and conditions of a business license.</p>
